- What does it mean that our citizenship is in heaven? What idea is the Apostle Paul trying to communicate (Philippians 3:20)? (see 2 Corinthians 5:20; 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12; 2 Peter 3:11-13)
- In what specific ways did the Apostle Paul and other leaders mentioned here model this kind of citizenship in their lives (Philippians 3:17)? (see Philippians 1:29–30; 2:3–4; 3:9; 3:12–14). Which of these modeled behaviors most challenges the living out of your citizenship today?
- What small act of service or caring toward another can you take to demonstrate your heavenly citizenship today?
